# Workshop on Organic Pest Management in Horticulture Crops at Bagalkot



One day work shop on organic pest management in horticultural crops was organized by Directorate of Extension, HEEU, Bagalkot on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2016. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. D. L. Maheswar inaugurated the programme by lighting the solar lamp. In his inaugural speech, he mentioned about drip irrigation project adopted in Hungund Taluk, a proud project of the country, stressed about the scope of organic farming in horticulture. Farmers are using 65 per cent of insecticides, 16 per cent of weedicides and 15 per cent of fungicides for pest management. Among 700 insecticides, only 175 have been registered and rest of the insecticides have not been registered, thus their use causing environmental pollution. Approximately, 8 lakh people are suffering from side effects of insecticides. It is a time to shift to biological methods and go for organic cultivation. Director of Extension, Dr. Y. K. Kotikal in his presidential remarks mentioned about different farmer friendly programmes namely MG- MG, Skill Oriented Programmes, organic disease management in pomegranate and use of organic fertilizers and organic pest management for the betterment of the state and country as well. Dr. Venkatram Reddy, Dr. Shivaram Bhatt, principal Scientists, IIHR, Bengaluru, Dr. Richa Varshie and Dr. Lalitha, Scientist, NBAIR, Bengaluru. Dr. R. K. Patil, Professor, UAS, Dharwad and Mr. S. T. Patil progressive organic farmer Indi were the resource persons during workshop. An exhibition was organized by Dr. Venkateshalu, Dr. Gangadhar Narbenchi, Dr. J. P. Gopali, Dr. Mahesh Y. S, Dr. Vijaymahatesh, Dr. Vijay Hosamani, Dr. Ambresh, Dr. Shashikumar and Dr. Uma Akki, to educate the farmers about different bioagents and non chemical methods of pest control.Dr. Venkateshulu proposed vote of thanks.
